**Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions:**

**Can I borrow a book from a friend who has taken the class?** Most students choose to purchase the book through Avera McKennan, and receive the book the first night of class. We are using Brady Emergency Care 11<sup>th</sup> Edition. If you purchase the book elsewhere or borrow a book, you must also purchase a code for the website CourseCompass at <http://www.bradybooks.com/store/product.aspx?isbn=0132079321>. The cost is \$23. If you choose to purchase the book through Avera McKennan, this code is included with your textbook.

**How much study time will I need?** The course often covers 2 chapters per evening for the evening class, and 4 chapters per day for the daytime class. In addition, students must take a short multiple-choice quiz over each chapter prior to class. Module exams are given frequently during class.

**Do I need computer access?** The quizzes are taken on the website CourseCompass, so computer access is needed. The School of EMS has computers available for student use. We recommend students do not use wireless Internet to take the quizzes.

**Are there any other fees?** At the end of the course, students will take an exam through the National Registry of EMTs to become certified. The cost of this exam is \$70, and will be paid to the National Registry of EMTs.
